

"In this photograph, Andrews University graduate student Laura Roncarolo (center) receives a grant-in-aid from Altrusa International, inc., the oldest women's service club. The organization was established in 1917 and provides funds to international women graduate students who are studying in American universities and who plan to return to their home countries. Altrusa International awarded grants to Andrews University students many times throughout the 1960s and 1970s, according to reporting in the Lake Union Herald. Here, Dr. Ruth Murdoch (right) presents a check to Laura Roncarolo. Dr. Mercedes Dyer (left), vocational services chairman of the Altrusa Club of Benton Harbor and St. Joseph, recommended Mrs. Roncarolo for the award. Mrs. Roncarolo received a Master of Arts in educational psychology from Andrews University in August, 1976, and subsequently pursued post-graduate studies."
