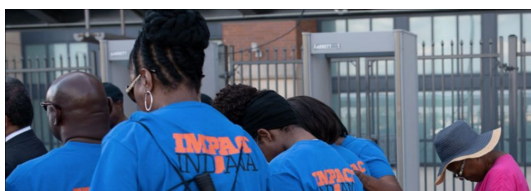

Michigan Youth Department gears up to help Detroit residents



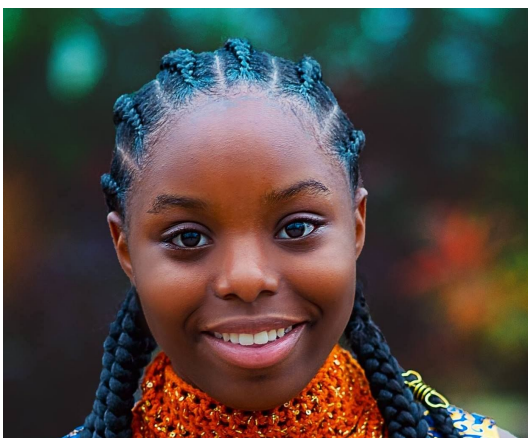
