



The group portrait shows the 1903 staff of the Life Boat, a periodical published by the International Medical Missionary and Benevolent Association out of Chicago, Illinois. The magazine printed missionary stories, reported on social needs, and encourage readers to support mission work at home and abroad. The February 1, 1903, issue included an article by Effie Northrup (pictured back row, left), which reported that three Life Boat staff members had just delivered clothing to poor children in Chicago. "The little girls clapped their hands with joy when they saw the dresses, and one said, 'Oh mamma, it seems just like Santa Claus has been here," Effie reported. "Happiness comes to the one who is able to supply food and clothing and comfort to these needy ones." Life Boat was printed from 1898 to 1932.
