

Some Seventh-day Adventists have the idea that camp meetings are unique to our movement. Actually, North American camp meetings have their origins in the religious life of the American frontier at a time when the population was spread over vast areas with few ministers to serve the sparse population. Believers -- and the curious -- would gather sometimes for weeks on end in portable communities where they would spend hours in Bible study, singing and prayer. These were a key part of the Second Great Awakening both in North America and in Great Britain.

Adventists very early adopted this form of gathering and camp meetings became very much a part of the movement's religious and social fabric. And why not? After all, Scripture says: "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:24-25; emphasis added)
