

This Month in Adventist History



In 1928, the Lake Union Herald named June 'Camp-Meeting Season,' and with good reason. That month, four different camp meetings were held across the Lake Union. This photograph captures the location of Indiana's camp meeting, which was held on the grounds of Indiana Academy in Cicero, June 7-17, 1928.

Here a banner welcomes attendees as they arrive. The academy made all its buildings available for the use of camp meeting guests. Even the chapel building served as housing for families. To encourage attendance, the president of Indiana Conference published this heart-felt call in the *Lake Union Herald* shortly before the meetings began: 'We are living in the closing scenes of this world's history. The nations of the earth are in turmoil. These annual meetings such as we are about to hold in Cicero are designed of God to bring us in Divine touch with him...I am appealing most earnestly to everyone who reads this letter to spend some time at the camp-meeting this year.'
