

These three Pathfinders helped deliver kindness baskets to 75 homes for Thanksgiving in 1973. The baskets were distributed to needy families who might not otherwise have a cheerful holiday. Thousands of canned goods, fresh vegetables, and dairy products were contributed by local residents in a drive held just before Halloween, and the AU Evergreens Pathfinder club organized and delivered the baskets.
