ASI Lake Union Meeting Highlights Mental Health

<u>ASI Lake Union</u> Spring Fellowship was held April 28-29 at <u>Tinley Park</u> <u>Convention Center</u>, Illinois with the theme, "Sharpen the Wedge: Thriving in a Post-Pandemic World, Guilt-free Selfcare." The keynote speaker was Dr. <u>Neil Nedley</u>, and seminar presenter was Maydis Skeete.

More than \$15,000 was raised, exceeding the goals for three major ministries. These include Advocates for Southeast Asians and the Persecuted (ASAP Ministry's which has a goal of helping Karen refugees in Wisconsin; FARM STEW, whose mission is to improve the health and well-being of poor families and vulnerable people by equipping them with practical life skills, and Weimar Institute, founded to impart a knowledge of God to its students.

This year also marked a turn of leadership. The newly elected officers to serve for the term 2023 – 2025 are: Gianluca Bacchiocchi (President), Lisa Isensee (General Vice President), Debbie Young (Vice President of Communications), Michael Clendenning (Vice President of Evangelism), Tom Morrissy (Vice President of Finance), Trudi Starlin (Vice President of Membership), and Carmelo Mercado (Executive Secretary).

Private Foundation Invests in Lake Union Ministries

The Versacare Foundation awarded grants totaling almost \$200,000 across the Lake Union.

Berean Church in South Bend, Ind,, **Caught Up Ministries** based in Detroit, and **Harbor of Hope Church** in Benton Harbor, Mich., were three of the 11 ministries receiving \$40,000 grants. According to a Versacare news release, these top awardees were "by invitation to applicants implementing proven successful practices as well as organizations demonstrating creativity and innovation in the delivery of services that meet the needs of individuals or groups."

Versacare Foundation is an independent foundation which has been serving Seventh-day Adventist ministries and a select few other humanitarian efforts with financial grants since 1990. A self-funded lay organization, its board is comprised of both lay Adventists and present and former Adventist church employees.

Parkinson Voice Project Funds Andrews University Clinic

The Andrews University Speech-Language & Hearing Clinic was recently awarded a SPEAK OUT! Therapy and Research Center Grant by the <u>Parkinson Voice Project</u>. Valued at more than \$280,000, the award provides extensive training and services offered by the nonprofit Parkinson Voice Project over the next five years, including \$10,000 per year for resources over the same period. Andrews is one of 16 universities across the country who have been awarded this newly introduced grant, which enables universities to provide free teletherapy to Parkinson's patients anywhere in the recipient's state.

The grant supports research in the School of Communication Sciences & Disorders and enables Andrews University to train students in the SPEAK OUT! program. It also allows the clinic to have a wider reach within the state of Michigan, giving patients access to free teletherapy for voice, speech and swallowing disorders that can accompany Parkinson's disease.


