


"Caring Heart Award"

This Month in Adventist History



On June 7, 1960, thirty-one Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary students joined forces with members of the Rockford, Illinois Seventh-day Adventist church to set up and inflate this "Airatorium" (air auditorium) in the field next to the Rockford church school. The Airatorium hosted the Summer Field School in Evangelism, which ran for three weeks. During this time, church members and seminarians ministered to the citizens of Rockford through individual bible studies and evangelistic meetings. The program ended with an all-night prayer session and several successful altar calls. A lively report appeared in the Lake Union Herald issue for July 26, 1960, and follow-up Field Schools were planned for 1961 and 1962.
