Hundreds of Educators From Across the Lake Union Receive Boost at National Teachers' Convention

Three hundred educators and church leaders from across the Lake Union territory gathered Aug. 7-10 for the fifth North American Division <u>Teachers'</u> <u>Convention</u> in Phoenix, Arizona.

The convention, themed "Something Better," attracted over 6,000 who were reminded that Jesus offers each of us "something better" than the world can provide. Educators had the opportunity to attend over 300 presentations, visit more than 150 exhibitors, as well as enjoy devotional talks and uplifting music. This year's convention featured new attractions such as Ed Talks, Spark Tank—a chance for schools to make their best pitch to reach their communities for Christ— and a special track for Early Childhood Education.

The Lake Union Education Department hosted a banquet for its educators on Wednesday evening and during the program several teachers shared how the convention has sparked numerous ideas for re-engaging students in the classroom. Comments ranged from: "I'm so glad I was able to attend," "The Ed Talks were amazing as I got great tools," "I learned a lot about how I want my classroom to be."


We praise God to our dedicated educators marching forward as the hands and feet of Jesus in the classroom.

"Andrews Bible Commentary" Goes to Every Adventist School in North America

Students in every Adventist school in North America will have access this fall to the new "Andrews Bible Commentary" through an initiative financially sponsored by three organizations, according to John Wesley Taylor, president of Andrews University.

Taylor, who took office at Andrews on July 1, said that the Foundation for Adventist Education, the North America Division Office of Education and Andrews University partnered to organize funding to send a set of the commentary to every Adventist school in the North American Division (NAD). The Foundation for Adventist Education is a private foundation operated by the family of Ed and Ann Zinke, of Silver Spring, Maryland, and supports many projects focused on advancing deep biblical understanding of Adventist theology and the philosophy of education.



"We Knew Nothing Was Too Big for God, But It Was Daunting..."

Battle Creek Academy's future was looking rather bleak. Their roof was crumbling, and if they couldn't raise 1.2 million, they would have to close the school.

Battle Creek Academy (BCA) has been in formal operation for a stunning 151 years, serving Battle Creek's youth since 1872, when the school was established. Before that, in 1856, Mary Osgood unofficially led the school out of her home and charged each student 25 cents tuition. BCA has since expanded from just one teacher and a parlor to a building located on 44 acres with eight classrooms, a gymnasium, science lab, music room, fitness center, three-bay garage and more, all supported by over fifteen faculty members.

The school is not a stranger to adversity. The academy's original three-story school building was built in 1903 on North Kendall street in Battle Creek, and served for 42 years before being destroyed in a fire in 1945. Three years later, a new school was dedicated on September 6, 1948. The school opened for its first academic year on September 9, 1948, and has undergone numerous expansions since then. Thousands of alumni have been blessed to receive an education focused on scholastic excellence and spiritual growth. This year, it all threatened to crumble.


