Thirty Baptized at Conclusion of Indiana Gatherings

Two Indiana ethnic groups added to their numbers at the conclusion of special meetings. Over 600 gathered for the Indiana Hispanic Family Camp Meeting which convened during the Labor Day weekend, September 1-4, at Timber Ridge Camp. On Sabbath, 14 people gave their lives to Christ.

Meanwhile, on Sabbath, September 2, evangelistic meetings conducted at both the Maranatha and Philadelphie Haitian churches culminated with baptisms performed at the Irvington church. Sixteen were baptized. Pastors Andre Trofort and Michelet William administered the meetings.

"We praise God for answering our prayers and making these meetings an opportunity for people to have an encounter with God and His Word and to witness miracles," said Noel Ojeda, Indiana's multicultural ministries director.



Southern Union Schools First to Adopt Mission: Invent

Adventist schools in the Southern Union are the first to deeply engage with Mission: Invent, an initiative created at Andrews University to promote innovation and creativity. The program champions STEM learning for K-12 Seventh-day Adventist students in the United States and Canada. Launched in fall of 2021, the initiative was made initially possible by a grant from the Versacare Foundation and sponsorships from Adventist colleges, universities and unions in North America.

The 34th quinquennial session for the Michigan Conference gets underway on Sunday, Sept. 24 at the Cedar Lake Church in Edmore.


