Keys to Growth on Social Media

Explosive growth in a Michigan church's online presence is allowing greater reach of the gospel of Christ and the Three Angel's Messages. Village Seventh-day Adventist Church YouTube subscribers rose from from around 5,000 to over 32,000 in less than a three-year span. Furthermore, channel analytics show that Village content reaches 1 or more persons in over 90 different countries.

For an individual church in the North American Division to reach this number of subscribers is extremely rare at this point in time. Even when a church is connected to a university or well-known evangelist, having 32,000 subscribers is a very limited attainment. What are some of the keys to this growth?







This Month in Adventist History



Did you know that Bethel Junior Academy is the oldest Seventh-day Adventist secondary school in Wisconsin? One of the original buildings is pictured here, as seen in 1900. Established in 1898 in Arpin, Wisconsin, the school was first called Woodland Academy in honor of the surrounding forest. The location was chosen for its remoteness. The March 19, 1901, *Advent Review and Sabbath Herald* reported that "the school is twelve miles from a city, [and] the surrounding country is thinly settled."

100 names in hand, they mailed copies of Christ's Object Lessons to rural Wisconsin Adventists "who have not the privilege of Sabbath meetings," helping to bridge the gap for their far-flung fellow believers.
